EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROCEDURES

1. Rationale

The Ministry of Education has mandated the establishment of this policy. The Simcoe County District School Board (SCDSB) recognizes the need to provide a safe environment for all of its students and staff. A safe, supportive learning and working environment has a positive effect on student and staff achievement, contributes to well-being and is essential for everyone to reach their full potential.

There are a number of emergencies that could occur. Some will impact a school/site, while others may affect the entire community. Some of the emergencies our schools/sites may face include: bus accident, bomb threat, death or critical injury, fire, hazardous materials/chemical spill, injury or medical emergency, natural gas leak, plant/power failure, trespassing, violent incident/intruder (Emergency Lockdown) and weather emergency.

2. Policy

It is the policy of the SCDSB to adhere to the responsibilities placed upon it by the provincial model for a local police/school board protocol and to take every reasonable measure to prepare for emergencies that might arise in our schools and workplaces.

3. Guidelines

- 3.1 It is the responsibility of everyone to contribute to a safe, supportive learning and working environment.
- 3.2 All principals, managers and supervisors must accept responsibility for ensuring that individual, site-based plans are developed, discussed and rehearsed to guide students and staff response to an emergency situation.
- 3.3 Employees must respond accordingly, following the defined site-based plans, to help ensure the safety of their students and fellow staff.
- 3.4 Students are obligated to follow the direction of staff during emergencies.

4. Administrative Procedures

The Director of Education is authorized to provide the administrative procedures necessary to implement this policy.
